The Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women (**CEDAW**) is an international treaty adopted in 1979 by the United Nations General Assembly.

In May 2017, Cincinnati City Council passed a CEDAW- related ordinance that commissioned a gender analysis of city departments and commissions. The Mayor appointed a taskforce to oversee the analysis being conducted by researchers at the University of Cincinnati and to make recommendations to the Mayor and Council about promoting gender equity.
